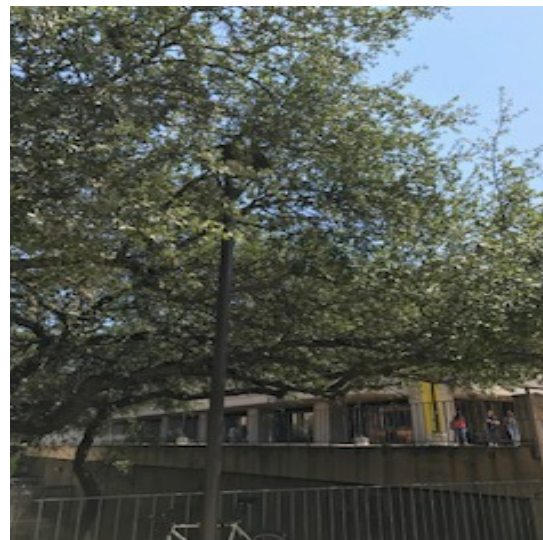
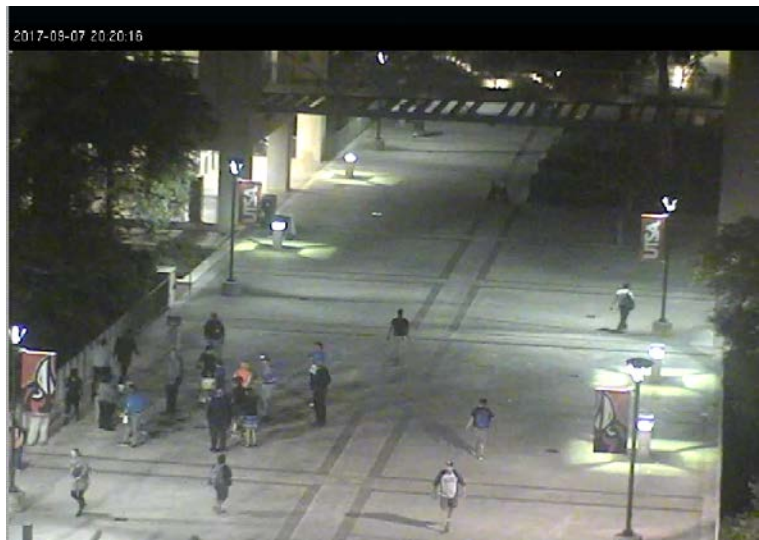
## 2017 Main Campus Safety Walk

- Removable bollards were laying on ground.

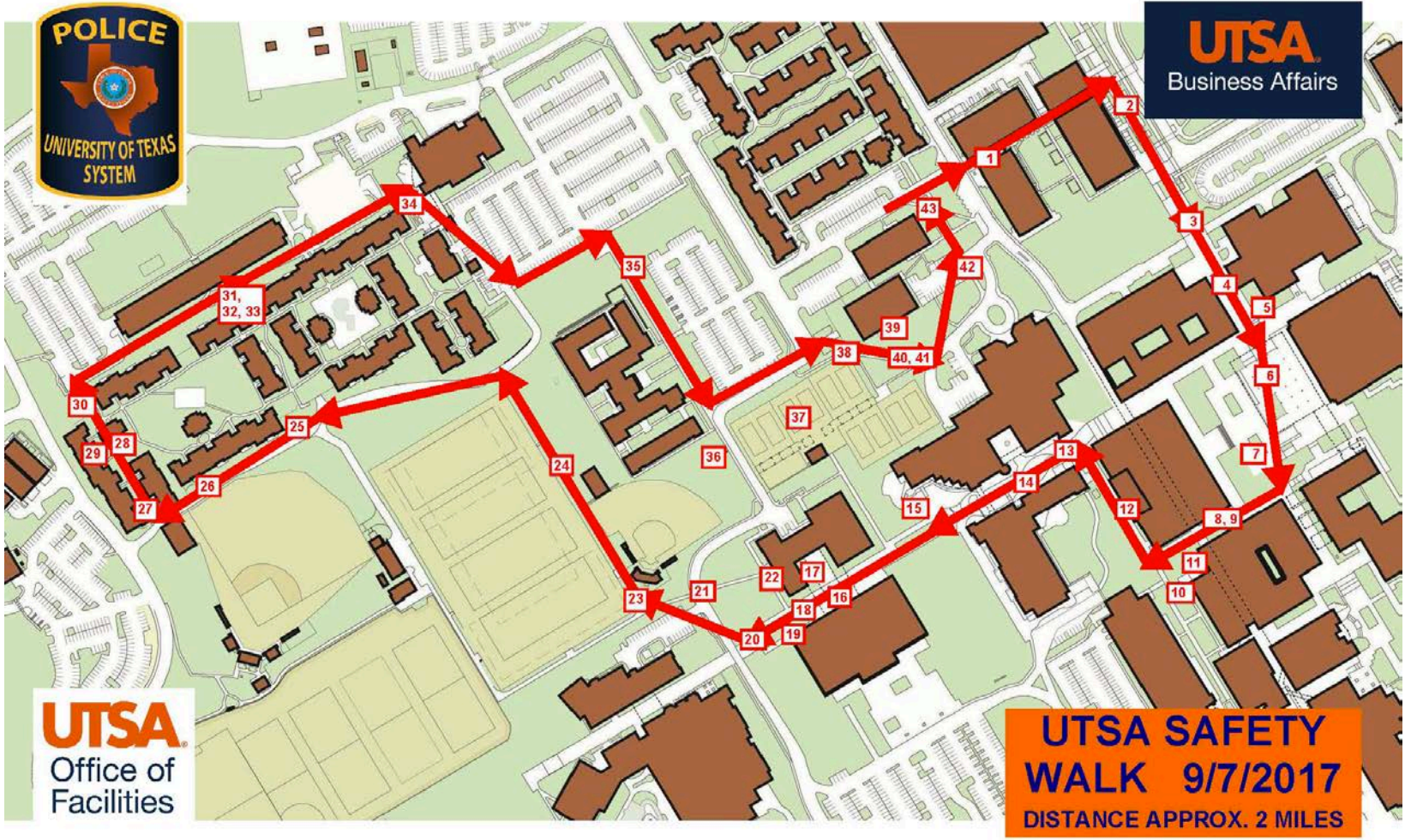


## 2017 Main Campus Safety Walk

# What is Rowdy Watch Student Patrol?

- Students assisting in monitoring the safety and security of campus. (Additional eyes and ears for the Police Department)
- Student employees working in pairs (three pairs on Main Campus and one pair on Downtown Campus) patrolling campus.
- Shifts consisting of six hours from 6 pm – 12 am; possible alternate hours at the Downtown Campus.
  - Providing walking and/or golf cart escorts.
  - Checking the security of buildings, including residence halls.
  - Checking bicycle racks for unsecured bikes and being a presence in the area.
  - Documenting any lights that are out on campus.
  - Weekly documented check of blue light emergency telephones.
  - Assist with Special Events
